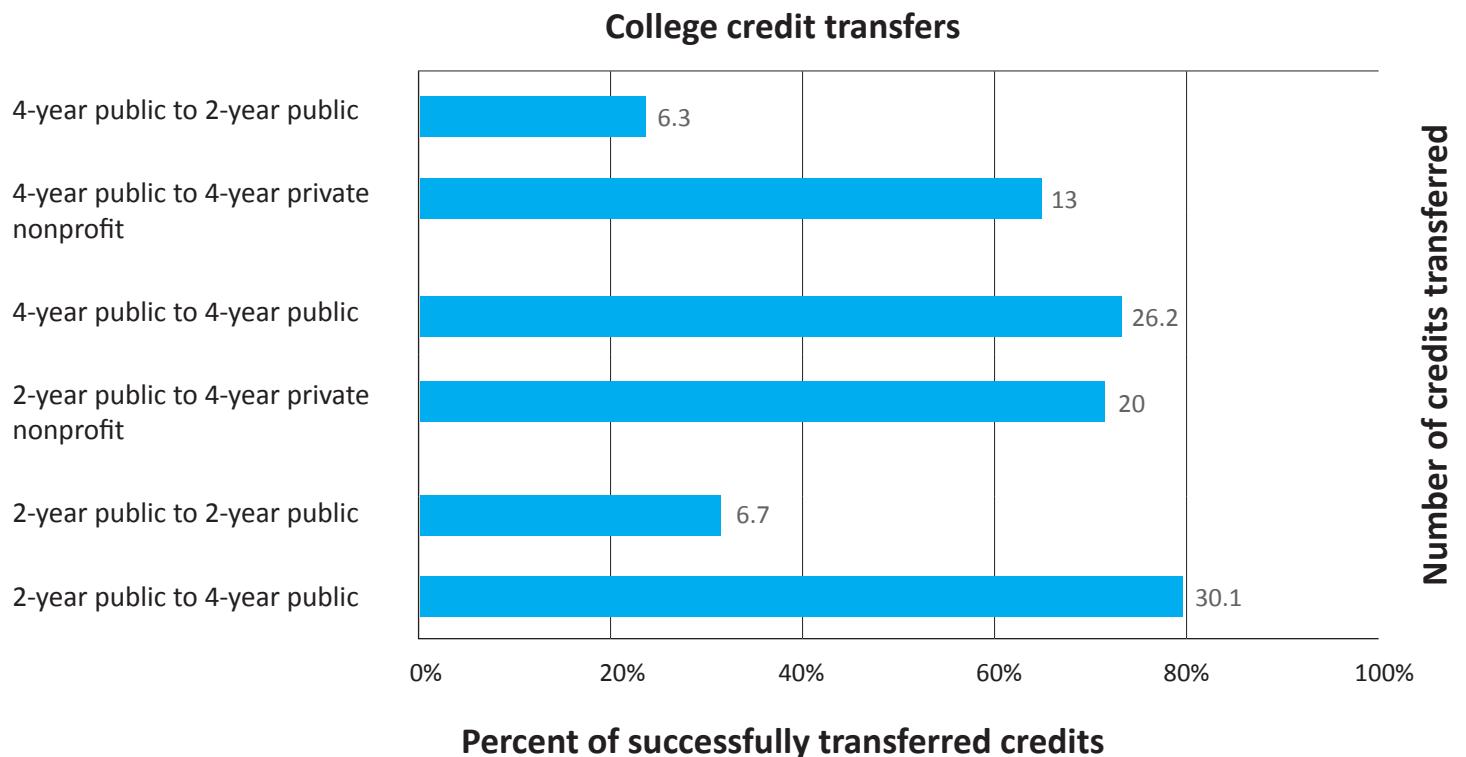


## Transfer success

The pathway from public two-year to public four-year colleges affirms the community college transfer mission.

Students moving from community colleges to public four-year colleges on average have the highest number of transferred credits (30.1). The same group of students also has the highest number of credits earned prior to transfer (37.7). Students switching from public four-year to another public four-year institution have a similar rate of credits transferring (26.2). The findings also show that about 56 percent of all credits transferred were from public two-year colleges.

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
