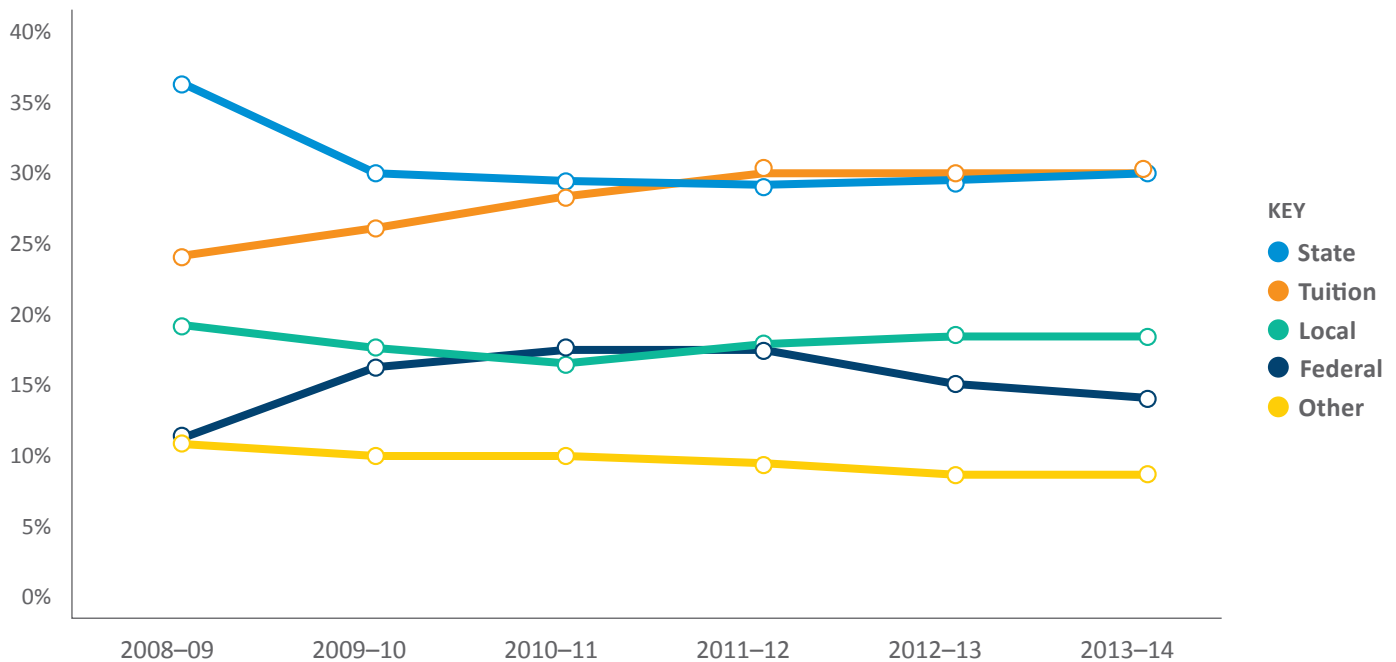


Where the revenue comes from

State funding at community colleges has decreased by six percentage points in the last few years.

Public community colleges have seen large decreases in state funding over the past few years. State funding decreased from about 36 percent in the 2008-09 academic year to about 30 percent in 2013-2014. Meanwhile, community colleges have become more reliant on tuition. Over the same period, tuition as part of total revenue has jumped from 24 percent to 30 percent.
