



Americans with a postsecondary credential overwhelmingly say that they received a high-quality education, according to a new report. Still, 51 percent of survey responders said they would change related decisions, if they could do it over. Of those, about 36 percent would have changed a major, 28 percent would have attended a different institution and 12 percent would have obtained a different credential. STEM graduates at all levels and vocational, trade or technical credential holders were the most satisfied with their educational decisions.
